





I'd like to introduce myself, I am Lex and I'm the Early Help Community Worker in the Community and Partnerships (C&P) team allocated to liaise and support schools and settings within your school cluster.

Our C&P teams work across Norfolk in partnership with a range of organisations, from education and health providers, to district councils and voluntary sector groups, to develop and strengthen the support that exists for families locally. We are one of the core partners delivering the family hubs approach in Norfolk. Through the family hubs approach parents and carers of children and young people from conception up to the age of 19 years (25 for young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities) will be able to access support:

- Within their community in places they already visit that are part of our Start for Life and family hub network
- Virtually through online and digital platforms (Request for Support Early Help Information and Consent Privacy Section 1 Norfolk County Council)
- By visiting a family hub site or by calling 01553 669651 and talking to an Early Help Advisor in person
- From another parent or carer, as we develop more volunteer peer support opportunities

We can offer each school one of the following per school term:

• Option 1 : An Information , Advice and Guidance Drop-In Session for families

This can complement and add value to existing planned events such as Parent Cafes and Family

Fun days.

Your Early Help Community Workers will visit to provide information about a wide range of services, organisations and groups that can help families with family and parenting issues. We can help signpost families to useful guidance or people who can help them.

• Option 2 : Pre-arranged Appointments

This will enable families to discuss and map their worries and identify next steps so that they can get help as early as possible, before issues become bigger problems. A private meeting space will need to be provided for these appointments.

Your Early Help Community Worker will visit on a prearranged date to meet with parents/carers individually who are finding family life difficult to cope with, or where worries adults may have, such as finances and mental health, may be impacting on their children. These pre arranged 45 minute appointment slots are to be booked by the school.

In addition, the Early Help Community Worker can also offer coaching and mentoring around funding opportunities and setting up groups through the Community Fund . This includes funding for provision for 0-5 year olds.
